

Consider becoming a Director of Angus Australia and assist in the future success of the Angus breed



What is the role of a Director?

Stewardship: Directors of Angus Australia are responsible for the overall stewardship of the Society. Irrespective of their state allegiances Directors act in the best interest of all members. They are responsible for making strategic decisions and overseeing implementation of these decisions by management. They provide insight, advice and support to the Society's management to ensure Angus Australia maintains its industry leadership position.

Term: The term of office of a director is two years with a maximum of 4 consecutive terms.

Purpose: A Director's main purpose is to work with their Board colleagues to ensure that the Society effectively provides the necessary services to support members in the development and marketing of their Angus and Angus influenced cattle. Directors liaise with State Committees, regional groups and individual members who may raise policy matters for determination by the Board in the best interests of the membership as a whole.

Strategic Direction: Directors are collectively responsible for setting the strategic direction of the Society and approving the Strategic Plan which sets out the objectives and priorities for the Society's operations. They are also responsible for approving a business plan and budget each year to address the priorities specified in the Strategic Plan.

Assets: Angus Australia holds assets of significant value, including cash investments and ownership of its own office building. Directors monitor and control these investments on behalf of the members.

Constitution and Corporate Law: Directors are responsible for ensuring the Society is governed according to the Constitution and Corporations Law. The Board acts in trusteeship for Angus Australia members. As such the Board will at all times recognise the trust placed in it by the Members and their requirements and expectations of the Board and demonstrate this by:

- Acting in the best interest of the membership as whole
- Gathering information from the members about their concerns, needs and requests
- Remaining up-to-date in matters concerning the members' interests
- Reporting annually on the performance of the organisation.

Board Composition: The Board composition is currently in transition with the introduction of both Nationally elected and State elected Directors. Once this transition is completed, the Board will consist of 1 State elected Director from each of the states NSW, Vic, Qld, WA, SA & Tasmania; plus 3 Nationally elected Directors. In addition, up to 2 Optional Appointed Directors, with skills or experience not present in the elected Directors, can be appointed with the agreement of 75% of the elected Directors.

Why serve as an Angus Australia Director?

- Contribute to the future strength and leadership position of the Angus breed
- Participate in the stewardship of your Society and in ensuring the needs of members are adequately serviced
- Utilise your skills and experience to assist in improving the position of your Society and the future of the Angus breed
- Represent your State's perspective while acting in the best interest of Angus Australia as whole
- Gain a wider industry perspective by meeting with members from across Australia

The commitment is manageable - usually 4 face to face and 2 teleconference board meetings, and approximately 6 teleconference Committee meetings per year. The commitment is of time only – all expenses are paid.
